From old Swedish games to games from Botswana, from Indonesian and Chinese games to Mancala, and to Tlacthi, the Aztec version of basketball, students will have the opportunity to have fun while learning about games, discussing and often negotiating their rules, and exploring their origins in time and place. The program will support the development of the students' mathematics thinking and reasoning (by identifying strategies and procedures to problem solve, and by altering them to change the outcome). The program will also support the development of geographical and historical knowledge and understanding, higher order thinking, creative and critical thinking, metacognition.
